



Your Stay at Sorelle: The Safari Tent (sleeps 6)

What to bring:

- Clothes (preferably) and shoes to suit the weather (wellies are advised if it's raining!). You may find hangers useful as there are no wardrobes for clothing
- Food and drinks
- Toiletries (including sun lotion and antihistamines)
- Your favourite coffee pot (there is no electricity, so a stove-top one is required) and fresh coffee
- Bicycles are welcome! The farm is located on the North Dorset Trailway with plenty of local cycle routes
- Charcoal for the firepit (or buy some when you arrive)
- Solar/battery torch or lantern
- Dog bowl, bed, lead, food and poo bags (if you're bringing a four-legged friend, please try to keep your furry pal off the furniture)
- Food storage containers/ foil/ clingfilm (eg. tupperware for leftovers)

We will provide:

- Bed linen, blankets, bath towels and hand towels
- Loo rolls & handwash
- Washing up equipment, tea towels, washing up liquid, 2 x bin bags
- Crockery, cutlery, enamel mugs, water and wine glasses for 6 guests
- Bottle opener & scissors (no vegetable peeler)
- Basic cooking equipment: kettle, pots, pans, trays, utensils etc. Please note there are no toaster facilities.
- Tea, coffee and a pint of milk
- A small fridge/freezer with ice tray (cold box available to hire if you require additional food storage space)
- Electric lights in the communal spaces and rechargeable reading lights in the main bedroom
- A bag of logs for the wood-burning stove, kindling, matches and firelighters (more logs can be purchased during your stay)
- 2 x deck chairs plus outdoor deck furniture
- USB charging points for small electronic devices
- Firepit for outdoor cooking with large BBQ tongs (charcoal can be purchased separately or bring your own)
- Small first aid kit
- Fire blanket & carbon monoxide alarm
- NB: there is no hairdryer in the safari tent, but you can use the one located in the communal shower block by the bell tents



Your Stay at Sorelle: The Yurt (sleeps 2)

What to bring:

- Clothes (preferably) and shoes to suit the weather (wellies are advised if it's raining!). You may find hangers useful as there are no wardrobes for clothing
- An eye mask for those early summer sunrises
- Food and drinks
- Toiletries (including sun lotion and antihistamines)
- Your favourite coffee pot (there is no electricity, so a stove-top one or caffetiere is required) and fresh coffee
- Bicycles are welcome! The farm is located on the North Dorset Trailway with plenty of local cycle routes
- Charcoal for the firepit (or buy some when you arrive)
- Solar/battery torch or lantern
- Dog bowl, bed, lead, food and poo bags (if you're bringing a four-legged friend, please try to keep your furry pal off the furniture)
- Food storage containers/ foil/ clingfilm (eg. tupperware for leftovers)

We will provide:

- Duvets, pillows, bed linen, towels, blankets, 2 x bath robes
- Hand and body wash, toilet rolls
- Washing up equipment, tea towels, washing up liquid, bin bags x 2
- Crockery, cutlery, enamel mugs, water and wine glasses for 2 guests
- Basic cooking equipment: pots, pans, utensils etc. Please note the kitchen is outside, but there is an awning for shade or rain cover.
- Gas hob with matches, kettle. Please note there's no toaster on site.
- Tea, coffee & a pint of milk
- Bottle opener!
- A small fridge/freezer with ice tray
- Reading lights in the yurt, electric lights in the kitchen & bathroom
- A bag of logs for the wood-burner, kindling, matches and firelighters
- USB charging points for small electronic devices
- Firepit for outdoor cooking (charcoal can be purchased separately or bring your own)
- 2 x sun loungers
- Small first aid kit
- Fire blanket & carbon monoxide alarm
- NB: there is no hairdryer in the yurt, but you can use the one located in the communal shower block by the bell tents



Your Stay at Sorelle: Bell Tent (sleeps 2)

What to bring:

- Clothes (preferably) and shoes to suit the weather (wellies are advised if it's raining!). You may find hangers useful as there are no wardrobes for clothing, but there is a hook on the central tent pole. Slip-on shoes could be useful for walking to the shower/loo block and back.
- An eye mask for those early summer sunrises (the tents are pale canvas)
- Food and drinks (NB: the communal kitchen has limited fridge space)
- Towels and toiletries (including sun lotion and antihistamines)
- Umbrella in case of rain
- Bicycles are welcome! The farm is located on the North Dorset Trailway with plenty of local cycle routes
- Charcoal for the communal firepit (or buy some when you arrive)
- Solar/battery powered torch or lantern
- Dog bowl, bed, lead, food and poo bags (if you're bringing a four-legged friend, please try to keep your furry pal off the furniture)

We will provide:

- Duvets, pillows, bed linen, blankets. Please bring your own towel. Hot water bottles are available to borrow from the shower block.
- 1 x solar lightbulb in each tent
- There is a shared loo and shower block with hand and body wash, toilet rolls, first aid kit, hair dryer, large mirror and hand towels. Please don't leave personal possessions in the blocks as other guests and visitors use these facilities.
- The shared field kitchen includes: gas oven & hob, small fridge/freezer with ice tray, basic cooking equipment, kettle, tea/coffee/milk/sugar, melamine crockery/mugs/glasses/cutlery for 16 guests. Washing up equipment with tea towels, washing up liquid and bin bags.
- Camping chairs (2 per tent)
- Communal campfire with logs, firelighters and matches.
